
Advent Worship - December 2, 2020

Reading Luke 2:1–16



⁸And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. ¹⁰And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹²And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"




- 6 How glad we'll be to find it so! Then with the shepherds let us go To see what God for us has done In sending us His own dear Son.

Litany of the Crèche

- P Sheep, cow, donkey, lamb, camel the animals from the nativity scene,
- **G** symbolize all the creatures of God's creation.
- The stable which surrounded and covered and housed all who came to see baby Jesus that night,
- symbolizes the entire physical world that God created and sustains, in which we are surrounded and covered and housed.

- The shepherds that came from the field outside of Bethlehem to see this thing that had happened,
- symbolize the humble men and people of lowly status, whom Jesus has included in His Kingdom.
- The figures of Mary and Joseph, who accepted what the Lord had told them through the angel messengers about the blessed Christ child,
- symbolize God's faithful people who wait expectantly for the coming of the Lord.
- The baby Jesus reminds us of our joyfully confession, that for us men and for our salvation our Lord Jesus Christ came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary and was made man, thus fulfilling the word of the prophet Isaiah, "a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call His name Immanuel." Isaiah 7:14
 - Let our nativity scenes remind us that the Lord Jesus came into our flesh and is truly our Savior.
- P Our help is in the name of the Lord,
- **©** who made heaven and earth.
- **P** Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting God, You caused Your only-begotten Son to be born of the blessed virgin Mary for our salvation.
