
The Imposition of Ashes

It is a centuries old custom of the Christian Church to mark believers on Ash Wednesday with ashes. This marking is a sign of repentance and sorrow over sin and a hope-filled prayer in Christ that a person, strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit, may amend one's sinful life. While the marking of the ashes is not a mandate from scripture, we realize that you may find this tradition personally meaningful and beneficial.

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
Collect for Ash Wednesday


Psalm of ConfessionPsalm 51:1–12

- Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.




Confession and Absolution

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Old Testament Reading

Joel 2:12-19

¹²"Yet even now," declares the LORD,

"return to me with all your heart,

with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;

¹³and rend your hearts and not your garments."

Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. ¹⁴Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? ¹⁵Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; ¹⁶gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. 

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the sixth chapter.

²"Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ³But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

¹⁷But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

¹⁹"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, ²⁰but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.


Lord's Prayer
